ATHLETIC HONOR CODE

The goal of athletic participation is to provide a rewarding educational and co-curricular experience for all students. All participants must commit to exemplary conduct and behavior as a representative of the school, representative of self and community.

As a participant of San Tan Charter athletics, I agree to the following:

1. To recognize that participation in athletics is a privilege and not a right; as such, the privilege may be revoked if the student-athlete does not abide by the Athletic Code and follow school policies.
2. To recognize that student-athletes have a primary responsibility to attend and pass their classes. STCS believes that our athletes are students first and athletics comes second. This means that their responsibility as a student comes before the privilege of being a STCS athlete. The academic eligibility requirement is no F's in any classes. Academic eligibility reports are run every Tuesday morning during the sport season. If a student athlete has a F in any class he/she will be ineligible to participate in games for 1 week. This will give the student-athlete a week to raise his/her grade before the next eligibility check the following Tuesday. Student Athletes will still be allowed to attend practice. We encourage all families to please use Infinite Campus Parent Portal to help monitor your students' grades. We also encourage parents to please work closely with teachers regarding grades.
3. To recognize that interscholastic athletic competition must demonstrate high standards of ethics and sportsmanship and promote the development of good character and other life skills.
4. To recognize that an athlete cannot compete in two sports during the same season without the prior approval of both coaches and athletic director.
5. To recognize that specific standards of behavior and appropriate consequences may be set by the head coach of each individual sport. Sport specific codes must be in written form, signed and on file with the athletic director.
6. To recognize that parents are also representatives of STCS and will act in a way that is supportive of STCS student-athletes, opposing team student-athletes, fans and officials. Should any parent/fan in attendance act in a way that is not in line with STCS standards they may be asked to leave the facility by the administrator on site.
7. To recognize that athletes are financially responsible for uniforms and equipment issued to them and must pay for items not turned in at the end of the season. Athletes failing to return school-issued equipment and uniforms will not be permitted to receive equipment, awards, or participate in another sport until all equipment/uniform debts are satisfied. All equipment is to be turned in to the coach no later than (7) school days after the end of the season.
8. To recognize that suspension for offenses to the STCS Family Handbook/Academy Honor Code may result in competition ineligibility during the time of suspension. Specifically, students will not use or possess alcoholic beverages, drugs, drug paraphernalia or narcotics. Students will not possess androgenic/anabolic steroids without the written prescription of a fully licensed physician (as recognized by the AMA) to treat a medical condition.

Any violation of the rules and standards may result in suspension from athletics for the remainder of the season of the sport in which the athlete is currently participating.
